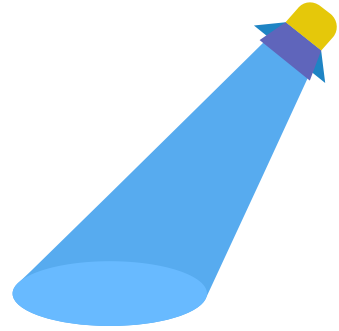


BENSON MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

Beverly Brady was born and raised in Atlanta, GA and will turn 91 this year in May. She has led a fascinating life.

After high school, Beverly attended the internationally renowned Cincinnati Conservatory of Music, majoring in Piano, the Flute, and the Piccolo too. After graduating, she returned to Atlanta and began her career as a professional musician and teacher. Over the next 65 years, she played with many professional organizations including the Atlanta Community Orchestra, the Band of Atlanta, and the Atlanta Pops Orchestra. She taught piano and flute at Georgia State University and gave private piano lessons, her greatest passion. She just fully retired a few years ago at 88.

Although her husband passed away in 1986, she continued to fill her life with music, great friends, social and community engagement. Beverly has lived in her Sandy Springs home for 61 years.

She is a charter member of the Benson Center. She and her mother Trudy Turner took a tour in October 1999, during the center's opening week and thought it was just fantastic.
